- . Nature constructs from the inside out not from the outside in, grinding down blocks of particular materi als to a desired shape, thus producing waste materials and down-cycling systems. This inside out approach will lead to a new design understanding, new curricula, etc.
- . 3D printing will further drive significant changes in material flows, logistics, spare part management, business models, etc. As of today, the discussion was mainly driven by a focus on novel solutions that technology enables, neglecting technology impact scenarios, life cycle assessments, etc.

Particular case studies and insights related to 3D printing and sustainability will be presented and discussed.
